 - planned study program (Learning Agreement)
 - language certificate/confirmation

COURSE RESTRICTIONS

Medicine and veterinary medicine as well as further training courses are not open to exchange students. While Master courses are in general open to advanced Bachelor exchange students, there may be some exceptions, mostly concerning Master seminars.

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION AND LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

German or English (except language departments). Students should have sufficient proficiency in German and/or English to follow courses and write exams, i.e., they should have at least CEFR Level B2 (for studies at the English Department CEFR Level C1 is required). We accept certificates such as IELTS (6.0 overall and 6.0 in writing section) or TOEFL (80 overall and 17 in the writing section) as well as a confirmation from the home university stating that the student in question has the required level.

LANGUAGE COURSES

Various free language workshops in German and Bernese German are offered during the introduction week. Further German courses are available during the semester on levels A1-C1. In addition, exchange students may also benefit from English courses (CEFR Level B1-C1). All German and English workshops as well as courses are free of charge. CREDITS

The University of Bern uses the European Credit Transfer System ECTS. 1 ECTS credit is equivalent to 25-30 hours of work (student workload). The full-time study workload per semester corresponds to 30 ECTS. For exchange students, we recommend 20-25 ECTS.

VISA REQUIREMENTS

EU/EFTA NATIONALS

No visa is required. Once in Switzerland, EU/EFTA nationals must apply for a residence permit in their place of residence. Provided students live in the city of Bern, they can register and book their appointment through UniBE International.

NON-EU/EFTA NATIONALS

For most Non-EU/EFTA nationals a student visa is required. Information on visa requirements is available at www.eda.admin.ch. The visa process takes at least 8 weeks. Please note that a tourist visa does not authorize to study in Switzerland. Upon arriving in Switzerland, students must apply for a residence permit in their place of residence. Provided students live in the city of Bern, they can register and book their appointment through UniBE International.

FINANCES

COST OF LIVING

Students must allow for a minimum of CHF 1,500 per month to cover living expenses in Switzerland. For further information, please see www.incoming-finances.unibe.ch.

WORK

Exchange students may work a maximum of 15 hours per week. Non-EU students are not allowed to work during the first 6 months of residence in Switzerland.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The Heyning-Roelli Foundation provides scholarships for talented, but financially underprivileged exchange students for travel and subsistence expenses. For more information, please see www.heyning-roelli-stiftung.ch.

HEALTH INSURANCE

Health insurance is mandatory in Switzerland. Students must either take out a Swiss basic health insurance or an international student health insurance recognized in Switzerland (e.g., Swisscare). The latter is the cheaper option.

Exceptions

- Students with a European Health Insurance card do not need to take out a health insurance if they are not working during the exchange.
- Students from Non-EU/EFTA countries with a health insurance cover according to Swiss law may apply for an exemption from mandatory health insurance.
